Minutes of Parish Council Meeting June 8<sup>th</sup> 1954

Minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed, and signed.

Correspondence The Clerk read a circular letter from the Royal Insurance Co. advising Parish Councils to insure with them. Due care & decided

being unliable to the public in any way which might involve a claim for damages (except on such occasions as Coronations when a one day policy could be obtained), there was no point in insuring.

A letter was read from the Clerk to the Devon C.C. which had been forwarded by the Clerk to the Crediton C.D.C. asking the Parish Council to submit a list of roads in the parish which it felt ought to be upgraded & thus made eligible for the 50% Ministry Grant. After some deliberation the Council decided that the Puddington - Hencford Gross - Normansland - Five Grosses road should be upgraded (milk lorries, agricultural, and holiday traffic). They further recommended the Westway X - Doctors former road (milk lorries, agricultural & holiday traffic and school buses): they noted that the latter road was included in the list of already classified roads but felt that, in view of the state in which the road is maintained, there must be some mistake.

The meeting then adjourned, the Clerk having been instructed to convey the Council's recommendations to the Crediton C.D.C. and the accounts for the year 1953 <sup>not</sup> having been examined and passed by the Council and signed by the Chairman.

### Minutes of Parish Council Meeting April 5<sup>th</sup> 1956

Chair.

Minutes

of the previous meeting were read confirmed & signed.

Resignation.

The Clerk reported that the Chairman, Mr. P. Cole had with great regret decided to tender his resignation of the Chair on the grounds that his health & advancing years made it no longer possible to carry out his duties as he should wish to carry them out & he therefore felt that the time had come to let someone younger take his place, he having held the Chair since 1919. This news was received by those present with genuine dismay & several members paid tribute to Mr. Cole's long and faithful tenure of the Chair: the hope was expressed that he would continue to serve on the Council & attend such meetings as his health permitted: his views would always be welcome, coming as they did from one whose experience of local government dated from the very early days of our Council which he joined in 1913.

It was decided to accept his resignation & Mr. J. Berry proposed that Mr. G. Smith be elected in his stead: this was seconded by Mr. J. F. Berry.

appointed Vice-Chairman: this was seconded by Mr. L. Gillbard & carried nem. nov.

Correspondence

The Clerk read a letter from the Devon Playing Fields Assn. urging the Council to join this organization. It was felt however that there being few children & no schools in the parish that no useful purpose would be served by doing so. The Parish had in the past contributed towards the Withenidge Playing Field.

The Clerk reported that the ex-Chairman had asked him to bring to the Council's notice a letter he had received from the British Empire Games Campaign Fund urging us to organize a Whist Drive or some similar event with the object of raising some money in aid of the Campaign. It was admitted that this was a worthy cause but it was difficult to see how any such event could be fitted in with any certainty of success at this time of the year.

Insurance.

Mr. Smith brought to the notice of the Council that they had certain liabilities towards the public & themselves & that they ought as a Council to be insured against any misfortune for which they might be held legally responsible. It was agreed that this would be a wise precaution & the Clerk was instructed to obtain from the Clerk to the R.D.C. information as to the extent of our liabilities & what cover we ought to have & at what annual premium this could be obtained.

Roadwater.

Mr. L. Gillbard reported that he was being caused considerable inconvenience, loss, & nuisance by water from the Council roads being discharged in a very haphazard way onto his land at four different points. The Clerk was instructed to take the matter up with the R.D.C. & Mr. Gillbard undertook to furnish the Clerk with exact details, O.S. numbers

ended March 31<sup>st</sup> 1956 which showed a deficit of £ 2<sup>5</sup>/<sub>9</sub><sup>a</sup> on the year's working: this was considered satisfactory & a precept of £ 7/10/0 authorized. Total Income had been £ 8/5/4 & expenditure had been £ 8/8/4. The Clerk explained that the Council was not actually overdrawn at the bank but was slightly overdrawn from his (the Clerk's) pocket.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

Minutes of Parish Council Meeting Friday Nov. 16<sup>th</sup> 1956.

### Minutes

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read, confirmed & signed. Arising out of them the Clerk said he had been in touch with the Q.R.D.C re. the roadworks at Hele Barton & they had promised to send the Divisional Surveyor (Mr E. G. Beer) to look into the matter: he had heard nothing since either from the Council or Mr Gilbard.

Roadworks

The Clerk said he had approached the Crediton R.D.C. regarding insurance & had been recommended to write to the Municipal Mutual Insurance at Exeter: this he had done & had received full details of the different types of cover normally required by Parish & other councils. It appeared that for a council such as ours the only real liability was towards the Clerk - i.e. employers liability. After some discussion it was proposed by Mr Smith & seconded by Mr Hayes that cover of

would probably not be great & would come from the annual precept. This motion was carried unanimously & the Clerk instructed to carry on with the arrangements necessary.

Hungarian  
Relief  
Fund.

The Clerk read a letter from the Chairman of the Crediton R.D.C., stating that they had received a telegram from the Lord Mayor of London exhorting them to help in raising money for the Hungarian Relief Fund: he went on to say that he hoped that our Council would be able to help by organizing a collection in the parish. After some discussion those present agreed that each should collect from the farms & houses in his own immediate locality & the Clerk was instructed to ask Mr. L. Gillbard & Mr. E. Cole whether they would be prepared to do the same. Mr. G. Smith undertook to take the proceeds with him to the Council Meeting at Crediton on Sat.

December 1<sup>st</sup>. It was generally agreed that it was a deserving cause as the refugees had lost everything they had had & had had to flee their native country.

There being no further business the meeting then adjourned.
